2013 COMMODITY INSURANCE FACT SHEET

Dry Peas

Montana, North Dakota

Crop Insured

The crop insured is all spring dry pea types in the county that are planted and grown for harvest as dry peas (not forage), in which the producer has a share, and for which a premium rate is provided by the actuarial table.

Counties Available

Montana— Big Horn, Blaine, Carter, Cascade, Chouteau, Daniels, Dawson, Fallon, Fergus, Flathead, Gallatin, Garfield, Glacier, Hill, Judith Basin, Liberty, McCone, Phillips, Pondera, Prairie, Richland, Roosevelt, Sheridan, Stillwater, Teton, Toole, Valley, Wheatland, Wibaux, Yellowstone.

North Dakota— All counties.

Note: For insurance in counties not listed, see your crop insurance agent for details on insuring the crop via a written agreement.

Causes of Loss

Adverse weather conditions
Failure of irrigation water supply¹
Fire
Insects²
Plant disease²
Wildlife

¹If caused by an insured cause of loss occurring during insurance period.

²But not due to insufficient or improper application of control measures.

Insurance Period

Insurance attaches on the later of the date we accept your application or the date the insured crop is planted and ends the earliest of: 1) total destruction of the crop, 2) September 30, 3) harvest, 4) abandonment of the crop, 5) final adjustment of a loss.

Reporting Requirements

Acreage Report—You must report all acreage of your dry peas both insured and uninsured in the county by the acreage reporting date.

Important Dates

Sales Closing..... March 15
Final Planting May 5-May 25*
Production Reporting April 29
Acreage Reporting July 15
Premium Billing August 15

*varies by county and type

Duties in the Event of Damage or Loss

- (1) Protect the crop from further damage by providing sufficient care;
- (2) Notify your agent within 72 hours of your initial discovery of damage (but not later than 15 days after the end of the insurance period;
- (3) You cannot destroy or put the crop to another use without our prior approval.

Coverage Levels and Premium Subsidies

Coverage levels range from 50 to 75 percent of your average yield. For example, an average yield of 1200 pounds per acre would result in a guarantee of 900 pounds per acre at the 75-percent coverage level. Crop insurance premiums are subsidized as shown in the following table. For example, if you select the 75-percent coverage level, your premium share would be 45 percent of the base premium:

Coverage Level	50	55	60	65	70	75
Premium Subsidy	67	64	64	59	59	55

Catastrophic (CAT) coverage is fixed at 50 percent of your average yield and 55 percent of the projected price. The cost for CAT coverage is an administrative fee of \$300, regardless of the acreage.

Insurance Units

Your insurable acreage will be grouped into one or more units in order to establish the approved yield, calculate a guarantee, and determine any indemnity.

Basic Unit (BU): A basic unit includes all of your dry bean acreage in the county by share arrangement. Premiums are reduced by 10 percent for a basic unit.

Optional Units (OU): In addition to, or instead of, establishing optional units by section, section equivalent, and by irrigated and non-irrigated acreage as provided in the unit division provisions contained in the basic provisions, a separate optional unit may be established for each pea type listed in section 1 of the dry pea crop provisions. The 10-percent discount will not apply.

Replant Provisions

Replant provisions are applicable, with the exception of catastrophic (CAT) coverage policies.

Prevented Planting

Prevented planting coverage may be available.

Rotation Requirements

Rotation requirements apply— see actuarial documents.

Administrative Fees

Catastrophic (CAT) Coverage: \$300 per crop per county. No additional insurance premium is charged.

Buy Up Coverage: \$30 per crop per county. An additional insurance premium is charged.

Insurance Plans Available

YP — Yield Protection

RP — Revenue Protection

RP/HPE — Revenue Protection with Harvest Price Exclusion

A request to change insurance plans must be made to your agent no later than March 15th.

Prices for Types with True Revenue Protection

(Smooth Green or Yellow, Lentils, Large Kabuli Chickpeas, or Small Kabuli Chickpeas)

- Based on average of contracted prices in region.
- Projected prices will apply to both revenue protection and yield protection.
- Harvest prices will apply to revenue protection only and will be based on average of USA Dry Pea and Lentil Council check off data.
- Projected price released by the 3rd business day of March.
